1. Peter Parker (Earth-616)

Being one of the oldest and most seasoned variants, Earth-616 Peter Parker is the classic Spider-Man, being smart, witty, and capable of withstanding pressure. With years of experience, he is both a mentor and moral compass to most other younger Spider-People in the Spider-Verse. His mind for science is only second to the greatest intellects in his universe, often offering multiversal technology and crisis-response missions.

2. Peter B. Parker (Earth-616B)

Typically regarded as the more experienced, worldlier counterpart of Earth-616's Spider-Man, Peter B. Parker carries the emotional scars of defeat with his enduring heroism. While age and fatigue have mellowed some of the idealism out of him, his off-the-cuff thinking and mentorship instincts only grow sharper. Peter B.'s history instills in him a wildcard aspect, especially in his more complicated missions, requiring his unique and tailored approaches.

3. Miles Morales

A novice with the multiverse, Miles Morales combines his raw abilities of bio-electric venom and camouflage powers with the conventional Spider-Man abilities. His philosophy remains flexible and open to discussion, ensuring he is a unifying leader during times of conflict. Miles' creative combat style is adaptive and responsive to altering dangers, making him a versatile teammate during missions.

4. Peter Parker (Spider-Man Noir)

Hailing from a 1930's noir dimension, this trench-coated Peter Parker variant brings nothing but his transcribing detective craft and determination to the field. Trained by hardship and existential despair, Spider-Man Noir fights crimes in perhaps the most unorthodox manner: with firearms, fists, and scant patience for injustice. His dramatic flair alongside calculated actions allow him to crack conspiracies and extract confessions from reluctant informants.



5. Peter Porker (Spider-Ham)

A toon-styled agent from a completely animated world, Peter Porker defies the laws of physics, biology, and often common sense. Where his appearance begs him to be underestimated, Spider-Ham's mastery of misdirection and fourth-wall breaking have made him a significant member of the Society. His bizarre physiology has proven to be priceless when applied to reality distortion missions.

6. Peni Parker (SP//dr)

Young but battle-hardened, Peni Parker operates the SP//dr mech suit: a biomechanical construct powered through neural synchronization with a sentient radioactive spider. Being a prodigy with deep emotional resilience, she balances cybernetic warfare with emotional maturity far beyond her years. Peni's tactical overlays and AI-supported targeting make her a precision-focused combatant.

7. Gwen Stacy (Spider-Woman)

Earth-65's Spider-Woman is acrobatically fluid and ruthlessly efficient, operating with precision and strong psychological prowess. Haunted by the catastrophes in her home world, she remains withdrawn but noticeably dedicated to the Spider-Society's cause. Her combat is notoriously rhythmic, aligning with her drummer family which provides closer agility in combat situations. She often drives morale reconsolidation, stabilizing emotional squabbles.

8. Miguel O'Hara (Spider-Man 2099)

One of the more unique variants, Miguel O'Hara is a one-man assault force, equipped with his genetically engineered battle suit with claws, fangs, and higher-sensor technology. Often deployed in unstable situations, he rarely wavers when faced with difficult choices, keeping as a last resort the greater good ahead of variant details. Disagreements with the other variants aside, his results remain unquestioned as he remains ruthless in action and measured speech.



9. Pavitr Prabhakar (Spider-Man India)

A blend of cultural awareness, divine intuition, and kinetic speed makes Pavitr Prabhakar's variant remains a formidable one. He disposes of enemies with charm initially and dispatches them quickly with aerial acrobatics. Pavitr infuses high-energy into team dynamics, often acting as a mediator with empathy and genuine concern. His dimension's spiritual vitality has proved unequalled in withstanding multiversal decay.

10. Malala Windsor (Spider-UK)

Being royal-born and unimaginably disciplined, Malala Windsor serves as a Captain Britain Corps diplomat, defender, and supreme enforcer. Dressed in ceremonial armor infused with stealth webbing and psychic dampeners, she walks the tightrope between tradition and tactical foresight. She is the most highly cross-dimensional security cleared Spider-Person of any Spider-Person affiliated with any governing authority.

11. Ben Reilly (Scarlet Spider)

Born from science and regret as a clone of Peter Parker, Ben Reilly possesses the same abilities in the same proportion of the original Spider-Man but with a fundamentally altered psychological makeup. Generally regarded as a wildcard, he still commands deep respect among agents for his fearlessness and unclad honesty. He operates most frequently in places where reputation cannot be jeopardized by first-string Spider characters.

12. Margo Kess (Spider-Byte)

Spider-Byte is the digital-borne Spider of virtual-metaphysical worlds, able to project hardlight and move through data-phases. Margo is a tactical dispatcher, scouting for intelligence gathering, and virtual decoy and often achieves soft incursions within firewall-protected realities. She prefers technical solutions to bloodshed but adapts quickly when needed, and serves as the key role in dimension-to-dimension coordination based on AI-operated security.





13. Peter Parker (Spectacular Spider-Man)

Working with youth vigour and wide emotional range, the Spectacular Spider-Man is a character who is driven by strategic idealism and tight-knit community engagement. While not as experienced as his mainstream equivalent, his decisions are informed by a principled core rarely rocked by pressure. His quick reflex and excellent multitasking skills make him inestimable during frantic, high-bandwidth combat encounters.

14. Cindy Moon (Silk)

Bitten by the same spider that bit Peter Parker, Cindy Moon possesses spider-sense amplification, bio-memory recall of events, and unmatched acrobatic agility. She now commands stealth reconnaissance and close-combat missions with deference. Her webs are livelier and more flexible, inclined to function as tactile sonar during nocturnal operations. Cindy's instincts give her an edge when it comes to infiltration and target acquisition.

15. Jessica Drew (Spider-Woman)

An experienced spy with pheromone control powers and espionage background, Jessica Drew joins traditional Spider muscle with super-spy moves. She blends hardline realist philosophical affinity with friends' allegiance, devil's advocacy in strategy briefings. Versatile at bombing disposals or commanding air squadrons, she thrives in combat-theatrical hybrid environments. She has clearance for interspecies diplomacy and negotiated variant forces into containment.

16. Hobart "Hobie" Brown (Spider-Punk)

A renegade anarchist from another, dystopian punk reality, Hobie Brown converts rage into revolution. With a guitar-axe, soundwave webs, and dislike of command structure, Spider-Punk thrives in anarchy. Unorthodox tactics, anti- authoritarianism, and subversion-based mission operations are the stuff of legend. Although regarded to be decisive, his results are undeniable.

17. Otto Octavius (Superior Spider-Man)

A former villain now possessing Peter Parker's body and mind, Otto Octavius brings insight on brains and ruthless pragmatism of villain deeds. Beneath his pride, chastened by hard-won humility, he now fights with cold calculation and strategic acumen. He is often sent to difficult moral dilemmas where detached rationality serves him better than emotion. He is the only operative to have direct inside knowledge on how villains operate.

18. Charlotte Webber (Sun-Spider)

Charlotte Webber fights from a position of strength against adversity, using her crutches and web-cane to extend her acrobatic fighting techniques. Her mobile movement overwhelms opponents who judge her mobility as limited. She advances accessibility of field infrastructure and has inspired recruits on physical ability spectrums, and is instrumental in redeveloping equipment standards for all Spider Society training outposts.

19. Takuya Yamashiro (Spider-Man Japan)

Equipped with the alien-sourced Leopardon mech and tokusatsu energy webs, Takuya Yamashiro is an elite agent trained in dramatic solo-fighting protocols. Unlike the majority of Spider variations, he uses equally martial arts and cybernetic assistance. His universe instructed him in ritual combat, often rushing at enemy generals in a head-on attack. The Leopardon remains the largest deployable asset within the Spider Society's emergency reserve.

20. Peter Parker (Last Stand Spider-Man)

A battered veteran operating in a world where nearly all the allies are on the ground, Last Stand Spider-Man is defined by weight and held-in rage. With a trench coat thrown over the red suit, he conducts missions with lethal effectiveness and medical brutality. He is normally sent to serve as a warning, or when hope becomes not an option. He's lived through more last missions than any recorded Spider.

21. Peter Parker (Spider-Monkey)

Coming from a monkey-dominant reality, Spider-Monkey possesses greater agility, savage strength, and instinctive combat. His methods are erratic and his morality more violent, feral guile substituting for rational restraint. Because of this, he is an unpredictable foe in combat, scoring victories against some of the most difficult threats. His value in wilderness warfare and high-stress survival missions makes him notorious in the Spider-Society.

22. Peter Parker (Spider-Cyborg)

Upgraded with cybernetic implants following a sequence of multiverse extermination attempts that had not killed him, this Peter Parker variant wields plasma-webbing, built-in weapons..

His moral circuitry is intact, but his loyalty is encoded into his mission protocol, allowing him to resist some mind-control effects on more advanced humanoids. Used primarily for urban suppression operations, Spider-Cyborg makes blitz raids with intimidating firepower.

23. Mayday Parker (Spider-Girl)

Peter Parker's daughter, Mayday lives up to her father's legacy with precision, confidence, and unbridled skill. A born leader whose allegiance is ferocious and ravenous in defense of her comrades, she bridges eras of spider-heroes by way of heart and determination. Her instincts mirror Peter's own, but with sharpened tactical knowledge and a quicker sense of faith. She has started training next-generation recruits to the multiverse in restored New York on Earth-982.

24. Anya Corazón (Araña)

Equipped with mystical tattoos and traditional spider-powers, Anya Corazon is a web-hybrid field agent of mystical surveillance and urban stalk. She is most likely to act as a spiritual liaison between ancient web ceremonies and modern combat needs. Her quick, efficient style is best suited for escort missions and artifact recovery. Her advanced Spider-Sense can detect broken web nodes as far away as 30 meters, even concealed.

25. Pter Ptarker (Spider-Rex)

A prehistoric dinosaur variant of a vicious timeline, Spider-Rex employs brute force, deafening roars, and web-like bone spurs to destroy threats. While inarticulate, Pter Ptarker possesses high strategic intelligence, and speaks in emotive pulses and instinctual movement. Being reserved for critical-level missions, he is employed in reality-collapse zones where common language and reason break down.

26. Felicia Hardy (Night-Spider)

One of the several forms of the archetypal thief-turned-hero, Felicia Hardy operates covert strike units with stealth-webbing and state-of-the-art burglary gear. Like all other Spider-Women, she uses espionage and seduction with accurate surgical weapons. Her kit is biased toward infiltration, sabotage, and high-risk extraction, making her an ideal candidate for reconnaissance missions.

27. Cooper Coen (Web-Weaver)

Flamboyant, thespian, and perfectionistic, Web-Weaver delights in high style and impeccable movement as acts of rebellion. Cooper blindsides enemies with fortified costume-weaving and defusing charm before surgically striking. Often utilized for diplomatic missions that require panache and public exposure. He is also a chief designer of public-facing Spider Society fashions.

28. Peter Parker (LEGO Spider-Man)

Constructed of modular interlocking brick logic, LEGO Spider-Man functions through narrative flex and physical modularity. He breaks, reconstructs, and bypasses reality rules using playful natural ability. This in turn makes him ideal when standard physics no longer applies. Traditionally, he is used as a failsafe agent in dimensionally unstable timelines that will loop out of control.

29. Dr. Aaron Aikman (Spider-Man | Earth-31411)

A scientist and armor engineer, Dr. Aikman combines scientific rigor to cutting-edge exo-suit technology. He makes his presence known among biologically augmented criminals and freak experiments, thus playing a significant role in the development of Spider-Society technology. Aaron's spider powers are supplemented by jet thrust and sensor suites, regarding him as one of the more technologically advanced variants.

30. Zach "Carson" Paul (Spider-Man | Earth-13618)

A rising hero from a corporatized universe, Zach Paul walks the thin line between entertainment pressure and genuine heroism. As a commercialized Spider-Man, owner of countless businesses, he's under surveillance at all times but never cracks under pressure. His honed agility conceals finely refined instincts and impeccable crowd control. Though hailing from a parody-laden world, Zach's tactical report success rate is in the top ten percent.
