Dossier:

1. Director-General Minji Park - Task Force Commander

A former Vice Minister of Unification who successfully combined a tough no no-nonsense security approach with cautious and tactful diplomacy. Park has the final decision-making power on all Task Force decisions and can force through directives if others are hesitant or stalling.

2. Major General Lee Sung-Ho - Deputy Commander

An experienced ROK Army officer who distinguished himself in urban warfare. Can rapidly deploy as well as maneuver military assets in the face of risk and danger

3. Colonel Pak Yong-Chol - DPRK Army Liaison

A long-serving member of the North Korean military who defected after extensive arrangements. Pak serves as the link to Pyongyang, offering unique insights into DPRK thought, strategy, and tunnel warfare.

4. Ambassador Han Jae-Myung - Foreign Affairs Representative

A career diplomat with decades of work at the UN. He provides a public face to the Task Force for foreign governments and ensures the Task Force is shielded from international blowback.

5. Consul-General Elise Monroe - U.S. State Department Liaison

Originally posted in Seoul before the crisis. She facilitates American intelligence and resources, and keeps Washington in sync with the Task Force's decisions.

6. Assemblywoman Cho Ye-Rin - National Assembly Liaison



An opposition politician who wants to add a certain amount of transparency and accountability. Cho uses her political capital to slow down rash action, or it can be used to express public support from the National Assembly when consensus is ideal.

7. Commissioner Kang Dae-Hyun - National Police Agency Director
Responsible for coordinating civilian law enforcement across Seoul. Expertise in riot control, surveillance, and hostage situations in urban environments.
8. Deputy Director Samuel Wright - CIA Seoul Station
Embedded agent from the United States. Provides satellite reconnaissance and wiretapping capabilities, and can facilitate covert U.S. support without formal approval.
9. Lt. Colonel Ryu Mi-Na - Counterintelligence Chief
Specialist in rooting out infiltrators, leaks, and disinformation. Known for her aggressive interrogation tactics and willingness to stop Resistance propaganda.
10. Dr. Hwang Jin-Seok – Tunnel Mapping Expert
Dr. Hwang Jin-Seok is a civil engineer who previously worked on DMZ infiltration tunnel analysis. He can anticipate Resistance egress routes and devise counter-tunnel pathways.
11. Engineer Choi Hana – Structural Integrity Officer
Choi Hana's official role is to evaluate underground risk. She determines whether tunnels are stable enough for troop movement or if they are risky enough to compromise safety during ongoing operations.
12. Director Kim Do-Hwan – Transportation Bureau Chief



Director Kim has carte blanche over subway, road, and rail infrastructure. He has the authority to re-route traffic on a whim, directly shuts down entire metro lines, and effectively closes down choke points across all of Seoul.

13. Deputy Minister Lee Soo-Bin – Ministry of Finance

Managing the economic impacts of the hostage crisis. Tracking ransom money, preventing the collapse of the market, and negotiating around counterfeit money.

14. Mr. Kenji Sato – Bank of Korea Liaison

A financial auditor who checks counterfeit currency circulation. He can authenticate seized bills as well as trace printing techniques back to the source.

15. Madam Yoon Ae-Ra – Mint Security Director

The boss of South Korea's money printing factory. She is an expert in anti-counterfeiting measures and can recall or freeze suspect bills.

16. Dr. Park Ji-Hoon - Cyber Defense Chief

Manages South Korea's cyber command unit. Able to block hacking attempts from the Resistance, jam communications, or intercept underground networks.

17. Analyst Olivia Chen - Signals Intelligence Officer

A professional in codebreaking and wire intercepts. Monitors encrypted communications so she can provide advanced warning of Resistance movements.

18. Captain Seo Hyun-Woo - Drone Warfare Coordinator

Simulates aerial drones that are used to map tunnels, monitor perimeters, and scout hostage situations.



19. Director Ahn Kyung-Soo - Ministry of Culture and Information, Government spokesperson.
He decides the official story made available to the public and the international press.
20. Reporter Maria Torres - Embedded Journalist.
She has special access to Task Force HQ to adopt different perspectives for public consumption. Her reporting can sway the public, orienting sympathy towards or against the Task Force, therefore legitimizing it or portraying errors in their approach.
21. Professor Lim Na-Ri - Propaganda Analyst
Academic expertise in mass psychology. She advises on counter-narratives used to neutralize the Resistance's "revolutionary" rhetoric.
22. Dr. Kim Seung-Min - Hostage Negotiator
Seasoned crisis negotiator. Equipped to include calming captors, de-escalating violence, and extracting concessions to avoid further escalation.
23. Colonel David Thompson - Special Operations Medic
U.S. Army physician assigned to a Task Force. Provides on-site emergency care and battlefield triage for hostages or operatives.
24. Ms. Lee Hye-Jung - Red Cross Liaison
Humanitarian representative. Advocating for the safety of hosts and capable of bringing NGOs into the Crisis Management response.
25. Mayor Jung Woo-Sik – Seoul Metropolitan Government



He oversees emergency housing, city services, and civilian morale. He must balance the authority provided to the Task Force against his obligations as mayor to protect Seoul citizens.

26. Inspector Yoon Min-Ki – Riot Police Commander

He is an expert in the suppression of protest. He has the ability to use non-lethal force to control or push civilians away from public gatherings and hostage zones.

27. Councilor Grace Lee – Human Rights Observer

She is here on behalf of the UN. She observes how the Task Force goes about their work and if they misbehave, she can file international grievances against them.

28. Dr. Shin Hae-Won – Forensic Analyst

Can trace explosives, weapons, or chemical residue to their origin, providing leads on Resistance supply routes.

29. Technician Alexei Morozov – Surveillance Engineer

Russian expatriate working with the security grid in Seoul. Can reroute CCTV, thermal scans, and facial recognition conversions for tracking Resistance members.

30. Commander Oh Joon-Tae – Logistics Director

Manages supplies, troop movement, and distribution of equipment. Known for being ruthless about efficiency.
